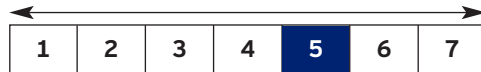

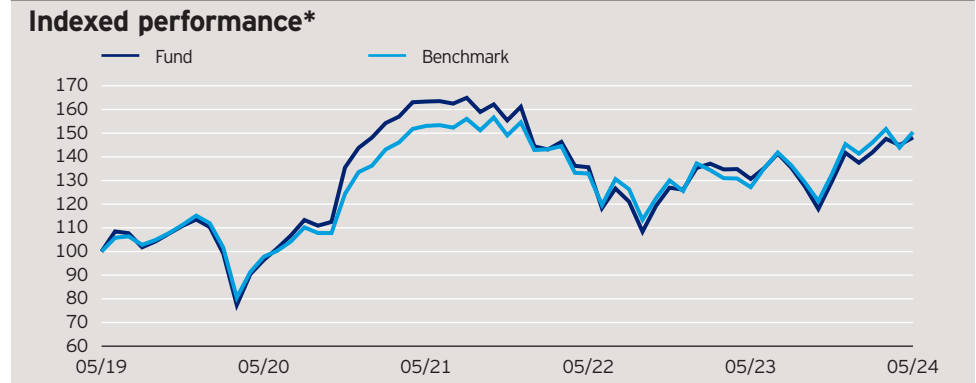

Fund Strategy

The fund, which is predominately invested in developed markets, is managed as two regional sub-portfolios, EAFE (Europe, Australasia and Far East) and the US. Michael Oliveros is the lead fund manager and oversees the fund's asset allocation process and the day-to-day management of the EAFE sub-portfolio. Juan Hartsfield is responsible for stock selection within the US sub-portfolio. In terms of the EAFE portfolio, Michael is supported by specialists in Europe, Asia and Japan as well as drawing on the regional knowledge and experience of the broader Global Smaller Companies Group (GSCG).

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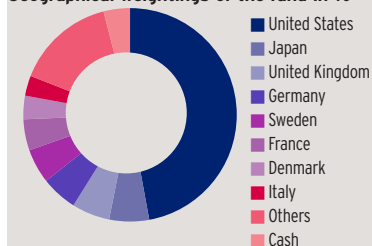

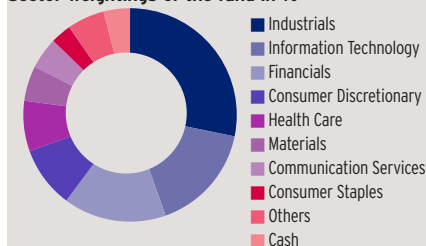

Exclusion Framework

The Fund embeds an exclusionary framework to specific activities based on UN Global Compact, severe governmental sanctions, revenue thresholds for certain activities linked to environmental and/or social criteria, as well as ensuring that companies follow good governance practices. The list of activities and their thresholds are listed below. Country sanctions	- Sanctioned investments are prohibited*
Controversial weapons	- 0% of revenue including companies involved in the manufacture of nuclear warheads or whole nuclear missiles outside of the Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT)
Coal	- Thermal Coal extraction: $\geq 5\%$ of revenue - Thermal Coal Power Generation: $\geq 10\%$ of revenue
Unconventional oil & gas	- $\geq 5\%$ of revenue on each of the following: Arctic oil & gas exploration; Oil sands extraction; Shale energy extraction;
